DRAMATURGICAL NOTE

Content Advisory: Spring Awakening contains explicit sexual content as well as sensitive themes such as verbal, physical, and sexual abuse, mental illness, abortion, death, and suicide.

Spring Awakening is a modern musical adaptation of the 1890's play "Frühlings Erwachen" written by Frank Wedekind. Wedekind expressed that his intention was to "Depict poetically the phenomenon of puberty so as to facilitate more humane and rational judgements among parents and educators." Wedekind drew inspiration for almost every scene from his experiences in life. The child of a violent and overbearing father, Wedekind struggled and was held back in school. Two of his classmates as well as his younger brother committed suicide. Spring Awakening explores how the oppressive and controlling environment, uncaring adults, and lack of comprehensive sex education contributes to the struggles and inner turmoil of young adolescents as they attempt to blindly navigate the sudden and confusing changes of puberty.

Religious morality of the time prohibited birth control and therefore knowledge of the subject was limited. At the time the most common approach was pulling out or the rhythm method, although animal skin condoms were also available. Due to the ineffectiveness of these methods, infanticide and abortion were common ways to deal with illegitimate children and limit family size, although abortion was criminalized. As Wendla's mother finds herself unable to speak directly and clearly about the topic of conception, she unwittingly endangers her child by assuming ignorance is a necessary component of innocence. As abortion laws change with the overturning of Roe v Wade, we again find ourselves in a position where young girls, unprepared for motherhood, may find their own lives at risk with the lack of accessible healthcare, regardless of their ability to give informed consent for procreation.

While German schools were admired for their discipline, the goal was not to expand the minds of students in order to develop critical and independent thinking skills. Rather, obedience was seen as virtuous and the primary purpose of education was to shape and mold the youth into loyal citizens, instilling a respect for authority and curbing socialist ideas. "Modern' citizens of Germany were expected to

be unquestioningly loyal subjects and future-oriented masters of destiny who were also burdened with staggering demands to respect historicity" (McClelland 37). School served to enforce gender roles through differentiated curriculum, with higher pressure placed on boys to succeed. Moritz seems to recognize this as he scorns Ilse for being free as a "butterfly" or the "summer wind" while he himself is tethered like a "laundry line" while expectations, like dirty laundry, weigh him down. We quickly find that Ilse and the other girls, are not free from the harmful effects of oppressive morality and abuse.

Spring, a time of beauty, rebirth, and new life, has also been a time of anxiety and stress over exams, correlating to a rise in student suicide in 19th century Germany as students anticipated failure or promotion based on performance. While Spring Awakening grapples with the tragedy of a generation unprepared for the changes of puberty, we are also reminded that after Spring comes the "wonder of purple summer" Of this metaphor, Steven Sater expressed, "I have been asked if the "purple" here refers back to "the wound" Wendla and Melchior have inflicted on each other. To the extent that we carry with us, in maturity, the bruises of our adolescence, it does. But it also represents the purple sunset and the blossoming of the long spring into a summer's day. For all those we have lost, for all that we ourselves have lost, our sorrow will recede, and the earth will burgeon and bear once more." If we can endure through the struggles and heartache of adolescence, we too can bloom and grow through the seasons of our lives. We can hold on to the message of hope that "all will be forgiven" as we receive the reminder that "there is love in heaven."

He is also hard at work with System of a Down's Serj Tankian on a musical version of Prometheus Bound, to be directed by Diane Paulus at the American Reparatory Theater. 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
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
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
