DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Why this show now? In a word: *joy. Xanadu* is all about joy. It doesn't take itself seriously, at all. In fact, it pokes fun at its own source material, the 1980 film of the same name. The musical has great tunes, a funny book, and roller skating! What could be more fun than that? Bonus: it wooshes in and wooshes out, at about 90 minutes in length.

For audiences, *Xanadu* offers a brief much-needed respite from the stresses of life, from the weight of our individual and collective burdens. For students here at the U, the show offers a chance to work on a specific kind of comedy in which characters are earnestly and fully committed to their objectives, no matter how far-fetched or ridiculous they may seem, even inside an extreme parody. It transports all of us to a special time in American history and pop culture, when leg warmers ruled, and disco was thumping, all with a tongue-in-cheek approach.

And yet, under the draped Greek togas, at its core, *Xanadu* is a story about the greatest joy of all: loving and being loved. For some us, like Clio, that kind of *Xanadu* is worth sacrificing immortality; for others, like Sonny, it makes us want to open a roller disco. And for all the people whose names you see in this program, it makes us want to put on a show!

The company and I thank you for coming to see our show, and we earnestly hope it brings you tremendous joy!

DRAMATURGICAL NOTE

A Trip to Xanadu

I thought maybe for one moment I could make all the arts converge in one place, Painting, music, dancing and maybe even athletics...Yes, I would like to open a roller disco. -Sonny, Act I, Xanadu

It's awful, but I did it. And it's there. Maybe for all time. Maybe for a long time, maybe for a short time, but it's there. No wonder those dealing with mortality delight so in creation. -Kira/Clio, Act I, Xanadu

You think that just because there are two wars and a depression it is not time for art? -Kira/Clio, Act I, Xanadu

I have a confession. Before August of 2024, I had never seen, read, or listened to the musical Xanadu or the movie on which it was based. I'm old enough to remember when roller disco was the thing and people wore leg warmers without irony while "making it burn" to Jane Fonda's Workout Record (this was before even VHS tapes!). So why had I missed the film that produced multiple chart-topping hits and the musical that followed 25 years later? I don't know. But when I did finally see it, I was stunned. What was this strange magic? Who came up with it? Had they been skiing down a mountain of cocaine while writing it? Why couldn't I stop thinking about this nonsensical mess of a film? I needed to know everything immediately.

Unleashed on the world in 1980—the same year as 9 to 5, The Shining, Raging Bull, Ordinary People, and Airplane!—Xanadu had everything: a big budget, huge stars, great music, and roller disco. Unfortunately, the one thing it didn't have was a good script.

Originally conceived as the story of a commercial artist who falls for a rock star's girlfriend, screenwriter Marc Rubel set Xanadu in Venice Beach. There, alongside surfers and sunbathers, skaters could be seen dancing along the Ocean Front Walk during the roller boogie

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in developing the script for Warner Bros., his simple California love story with a splash of roller skating began its long transformation into something monstrous, like a creature in Ovid's Metamorphoses.

The producers of Xanadu moved from Warner Bros. to Universal and hired a new screenwriter; Rubel was pushed off the project. Now Xanadu would be a musical fantasy and Olivia Newton-John wanted to be part of the renaissance of the movie musical. This changed everything... again. Xanadu was no longer a low-budget roller disco/ musical fantasy with unknown actors. Olivia Newton-John was one of the biggest stars in Hollywood, still riding the wave of her success in Grease (1978). The budget ballooned in proportion with her fame, and more big names followed: Jeff Lynne of the Electric Light Orchestra signed on to write songs, as did Newton-John's collaborator John Farrar. But the real coup occurred when the legendary Gene Kelly agreed to join the cast. There was just one catch: he wouldn't dance. Fortunately, he took a shine to the film's choreographer, a young Kenny Ortega (High School Musical), and changed his mind.

Through all of this, the producers never managed to cobble together a decent script. That left Robert Greenwald, the film's very green director, to fill its gaping plot holes with a series of unhinged musical numbers. These build to the mind-blowing finale, "Xanadu," which features a veritable circus and what appears to be team of roller skaters led by the ageless Gene Kelly gliding serenely through the chaos in a tuxedo. It is awful. And it is delightful. And it's there.

It is Xanadu.

Lynne's work with Orbison coincided with his position as 'Otis Wilbury' in the Traveling Wilburys, an informal 'supergroup' completed by Orbison, Harrison, Tom Petty and Bob Dylan. This particularly prolific period was also marked by his work with Brian Wilson on the ex-Beach Boys' first long-awaited solo album.
